## **Recreational Fires (Campfire):**

<u>Unincorporated Summit County:</u> The following type of recreational fire is allowed at all times regardless of the burn index: (Exception: If the Governor or Sheriff issues a burn ban or if a Red Flag Warning is issued by the State or Federal Forest Service).

- 1. Any recreational fire 3 feet or less in diameter and 2 feet or less in height.
  - 1.1 Fire must be in a campfire ring and used for pleasure, religious, ceremonial, cooking, warmth, or similar purpose.
  - 1.2 The fire shall not be conducted within 25 feet of a structure or combustible material unless the fire is contained in a barbecue pit. Conditions, which could cause a fire to spread within 25 feet of a structure, shall be eliminated prior to ignition.
  - 1.3 The fire shall be constantly attended, by a competent adult, until the fire is extinguished. Fire extinguishing equipment, such as a fire extinguisher or a garden hose connected to a water supply, shall be readily available for use.

<u>Town of Blue River:</u> The following type of recreational fire is allowed at all times when the fire danger is at LOW or MODERATE: (Exception: If the Governor or Town issues a burn ban or if a Red Flag Warning is issued by the State or Federal Forest Service).

- 1. Any recreational fire 3 feet or less in diameter and 2 feet or less in height, which has been permitted through the Fire District.
  - 1.1 Permit only issued to the property owner. This does not preclude the owner from allowing tenants to burn under their permit.
  - 1.2 Fire must be in a campfire ring and used for pleasure, religious, ceremonial, cooking, warmth, or similar purpose.
  - 1.3 The fire shall not be conducted within 15 feet of a structure or combustible material unless the fire is contained in a barbecue pit. Conditions, which could cause a fire to spread within 25 feet of a structure, shall be eliminated prior to ignition.
  - 1.4 The fire shall be constantly attended, by a competent adult, until the fire is extinguished. Fire extinguishing equipment, such as a fire extinguisher or a garden hose connected to a water supply, shall be readily available for use.

<u>Town of Breckenridge:</u> The following type of recreational fire is allowed at all times regardless of the burn index: (Exception: If the Governor or Town issues a burn ban or if a Red Flag Warning is issued by the State or Federal Forest Service).

- 1. Any recreational fire that is conducted in a UL listed or FM approved device, such as a manufactured fire bowl or Chiminea.
  - 1.1 The fire shall not be conducted within 15 feet of a structure or combustible material unless the fire is contained in a barbecue pit. Conditions, which could cause a fire to spread within 15 feet of a structure, shall be eliminated prior to ignition.
  - 1.2 The fire shall be constantly attended, by a competent adult, until the fire is extinguished. Fire extinguishing equipment, such as a fire extinguisher or a garden hose connected to a water supply, shall be readily available for use.

NOTE: Recreational Fires are allowed in wilderness areas, designated campgrounds, and private property if they meet the above requirements. They are not allowed within ¼ mile of the Interstate, Denver Water Board property and specific areas prohibited by the USFS or by Town Code(s).

## **Open Burning, Burn (Slash) Permits, and Bonfires:**

- 1. All open burning, slash burning and/or bonfires, require a permit from the Fire District and the Environmental Health Department. (**Please see SOP 408**)
  - Note: burn permits are not issued between Memorial Day and Labor Day.
- 2. No open burning or bonfires (over 3 feet in diameter OR over 2 feet in flame height) are allowed if the burn index is HIGH, VERY HIGH, or EXTREME.
- 3. No open burning or bonfires are allowed if a Red Flag Warning is issued or if the Sheriff/Governor issues a ban on burning.
- 4. Open burning and bonfires shall be constantly attended, by a competent adult, until the fire is extinguished. Fire extinguishing equipment, such as a fire extinguisher or a garden hose connected to a water supply, shall be readily available for use.
- 5. The location for open burning shall not be less than 50 feet from any structure. A bonfire shall not be conducted within 25 feet of any structure or combustible material, unless the fire is contained in a barbecue pit. Conditions, which could cause a fire to spread within 25 feet of a structure, shall be eliminated prior to ignition.
- 6. Fire Department personnel shall inspect the site of the open burn or bonfire prior to ignition.
